# **Guidance for All**

Our dress is smart and business-like to show our respect and care of ourselves and our community. When dressed in their uniform, pupils are representing Trinity Academy and they should look smart and well-presented at all times.

All pupils must wear the correct school uniform to and from school and during the school day. This will also be a requirement for school trips, unless otherwise specified.

All school uniform and physical education kit <u>must be clearly marked with the student's</u> <u>full name.</u> All equipment and footwear must also be named and this will be checked during the student's first lessons.

School physical education uniform must be worn for all PE and Games lessons, after school sports sessions and matches.

The decision of the Headteacher is final and students may not be allowed to participate in the school day if they are not wearing the correct uniform. If this occurs students may be lent uniform or asked to return home to change (following parental contact).

# <u>Daywear</u>

## Compulsory

- Grey blazer with embroidered school badge to be worn at all times (available from Famous School Branches only). Students are expected to wear their blazers at all times around the school unless permission to remove it is granted by a member of staff. Blazer sleeves should not be rolled up.
- Knee-length tartan skirt (available from Famous School Branches only). *This is to be worn on or below the knee.*
- Tailored black trousers (for boys or girls). *Straight, skinny leg trousers , capri-style,* 'ankle grazers', cropped, leggings or jeggings are not acceptable.
- School tie (available from Famous School Branches only), to be tied up to collar and normal length with seven stripes showing.
- Plain white shirt with buttons to the neck and standard collar. *Must be tucked in at all times. Top button done up at all times.*
- Black or grey <u>plain</u> tights, no stockings or hold ups are permitted. Tights with holes and/or ladders are unacceptable.
- Black socks only. No sports socks, trainer socks or nor over the knee socks.

# <u>Optional</u>

• Black v-neck pullover with stripe (available from Famous School Branches only).

#### <u>Shoes</u>

Please check with the school if there are any queries regarding the suitability of footwear. We will insist on student's wearing appropriate footwear. Students will not be allowed to participate in the school day in inappropriate footwear and will either be provided with alternative footwear or asked to return home in order to change.

- All students should wear black low-heeled polishable or patent shoes
- Ballet pumps, boots, suede shoes or trainers are not acceptable
- Heel height should not exceed 4cm
- Markings and logos are not permitted
- Soles, laces and stitchings on shoes should be black only

# <u>Sportswear</u>


#### **Compulsory**

- Black and purple round neck short-sleeved sports top with school badge (available from Famous School Branches only).
- Black and purple shorts or skort (available from Famous School Branches only).
- Black and purple socks (available from Famous School Branches only).
- Black socks for PE
- Shin pads and gum shields (for girls and boys). Any student who does not bring these items to school for PE lessons will not be allowed to participate in certain sports as failure to wear these items will increase the risk of injury.

• Trainers for PE (no fully black-soled trainers allowed as they will mark the sports hall) must be sports trainers, not fashion trainers such as or converse. Trainers will be advertised as 'non marking' and if in doubt, ask the shop



• Studded boots suitable for rugby and football (for girls and boys). Due to the specialist sports pitches that we will be using hard/firm ground moulded studs. No astroturf boots, blades, trainers or flat surface shoes are permitted for these surfaces. Boots must be as clean as possible. Click here for a link.



#### <u>Optional</u>

- Black and purple zip up jacket (available from Famous School Branches only).
- Black track pants with school badge embroidered under pocket (available from Famous School Branches only).
- Black leggings with school badge at the bottom of the leg (available from Famous School Branches only).
- Plain black base layers.

NB. If students want to wear outer clothing for sport they may only wear the items listed above. Alternative items purchased elsewhere are not permitted where it is stated that the items must be purchased from Famous School Branches only.

# <u>Other</u>

- Coats are permitted to suit the weather conditions but must be removed for lessons.
- Headscarves must be <u>plain</u> black and securely fastened with a plain black pin. Students must be prepared to remove their headscarves if requested by staff for any reason. Sports coaches request that students wear safety pins to hold headscarves during P.E.
- Coloured headbands, wraps or bandana/scarf type hair bands are not permitted. Hair and headbands are to be plain black or grey (of the school blazer). Black, neatly tied durags are permitted when worn to set braids.
- Vests or t-shirts worn under shirts for warmth must not be visible.

- No scarves, hats or gloves to be worn in school.
- Hair styles and colour must be natural, moderate and all of one colour. We reserve the right to ask students to change their hair colour or style if we deem it inappropriate for school.
- Students, where necessary, need a hairband to tie back hair during science experiments.
- A single, small plain stud earring in each earlobe is allowed but no other visible piercings will be permitted, including facial, tongue and nose piercings. These earrings will need to be removed for PE. If students come to school with unacceptable piercings they will be required to remove them in order to participate in the school day.
- No bracelets, rings or necklaces to be visible. No hoops or dangly earrings, nose studs or stretchers.
- Make-up must be discreet. No bright or heavy eye makeup or eyebrows. No heavy foundation. No lipsticks/ lip colours (lip balm is acceptable). No false eyelashes nor unnatural extensions, a thin layer of mascara is acceptable.
- No henna tattoos. Henna is only allowed in the days leading up to Eid celebrations and until it is washed up in the days after.
- Nails should be kept short, especially for PE. No false, acrylic nor painted nails. No nude or natural pink in colour. All will be removed on site if seen.
- Earphones should not be worn in lessons unless specific permission is given.
- If a student chooses to wear a mask for Covid-19 reasons, it must be plain coloured. Bandanas and snoods as masks are not permitted.

Wearing inappropriate uniform will be sanctioned according to the Behaviour Policy. If pupils arrive at school in incorrect uniform they may be lent uniform, sent to study in a designated area of the school site or sent home to change (after parental contact). The Headteacher's decision on all questions of uniform is final.

## Equipment for all students:

- Sturdy school bag suitable to carry A4 subject books. Separate bags can be carried for PE kit.
- Pencil case, pens (including black for examination and a green pen for feedback), pencils and pencil sharpener, coloured pens, pencils and highlighters.
- Rubber, compass, calculator, circular protractor and ruler.
- Glue stick and small scissors.
- Water bottle (these should be used for water only can be refilled throughout the school day).

## <u>Lanyards:</u>

All new students will be issued with a lanyard and access card which needs to be worn around their neck at all times. This is for identification purposes for both staff and students. The allocated lanyard must be used rather than any personal lanyard. If any of these items are lost or damaged they need to be replaced at the student's own expense. These can be purchased via Parentpay.
