



September 2022 first round allocation statement for Trinity Academy

As Trinity Academy is oversubscribed, the admissions criteria published on the School and Local Authority website have been applied to allocate the places that are available at the school.

Number of applications received

544 on-time applications (212 first preferences, 187 second preferences and 145 third preferences) have been received for Trinity Academy which has a published admission number of 180. However, due to the high demand for secondary school places in the city the admission authority has agreed with Bristol City Council to breach the PAN to offer an additional 30 places for Year 7 entry. The Year 7 intake is 210.

4 places were required for children with the school named in their Education, Health and Care Plan. This left 206 places to allocate using the published criteria.

How the initial allocation of places was made

The 206 places have been offered to the following children:

- 1. Those children who are defined as looked after children and children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order. (3 places)
- 2. Those children who qualified as music specialists. (18 places)
- 3. Those children who are at the named Feeder School. (24 places)
- 4. Those children with a sibling on roll at Trinity Academy. (34 places)
- 5. Those children who live within the inner priority area who were randomly allocated. (31 places)
- 6. Those children who live in the outer priority area who were randomly allocated. (89 places)

7. Those children who live out of the priority areas who live closest to the school as measured in a direct line from the home address to the school. (7 places)
