Our £24 million new building was opened in September 2021 by HRH Duke of Kent and features state of the art facilities.

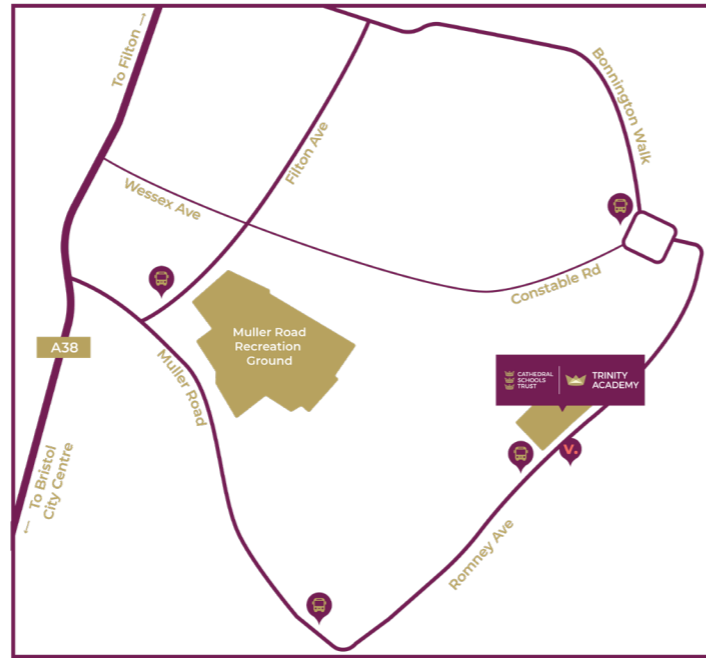
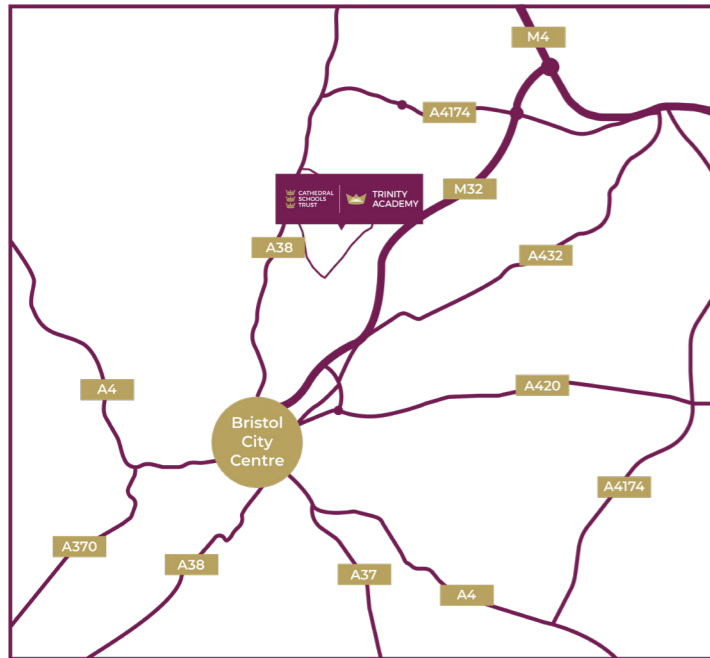

How to find us



Trinity is located in Lockleaze on Romney Avenue.

Bus Routes

Trinity is on or close to a number of bus routes:

First Bus 24: travels from Ashton Gate, Bedminster, Eastville or Southmeade and stops right at our door.

First Bus 72: travels from Bristol Temple Meads, the City Centre, Cotham, Filton or UWE Campus to Gainsborough Square, Lockleaze, a 10 minute walk from school.

First Bus 17: travels from the City Centre or Fishponds, Staple Hill and Kingswood up and down the Muller Road, stopping a 14 minute walk from school.

BCT 506: travels from Southmead, Horfield or City Centre, Lawrence Hill, Easton & Eastville to the Muller Road, stopping a 14 minute walk from school.

First Bus 70: travels from Bristol Temple Meads, the City Centre, or UWE Campus to Filton Avenue, a 20 minute walk from school.

First Bus 73: travels from Bristol Temple Meads, the City Centre, or Bristol Parkway and Bradley Stoke to Filton Avenue, a 20 minute walk from school.

On Your Bike

There are a number of cycle paths leading to Trinity and we provide secure cycle storage, lockers and showers.

Vois

There is a Vois stop right outside Trinity.

Cars and Motorbikes

There is some free student car parking on-site. There is also parking for motorbikes.



Steps to joining Trinity Sixth Form

Students will require 5 GCSEs at grade 5-9. There will also be a specific entry grade required for individual subjects.

1. February - August - Register your interest in our 6th form and receive our regular 6th form newsletters.

4. November - January - Apply via the link on our Trinity 6th Form website.

2. October - November - Attend one of our two open evenings.

5. January - May - Keep in Touch (external applicants welcomed to consultation events).

3. November - December - Decide your programme of study.

6. August - GCSE results day and 6th form enrolment.

7. September - Join Trinity 6th Form.
